The weighted percentage of adults (16+) who report their ethnic group as "White: British/EnglishScottish/Welsh/Northern Irish" in any wave (Wave 1-9) is in the range of 86%-88%. The corresponding statistics for all individuals (0+ years) is around 85% across all waves. The unweighted percentages are lower, which is expected as the sample includes ethnic minority boost samples.
