Description Dear support team, I am trying to create a variable measuring length of labour market interruption following childbirth in months. One important component of this is knowing when maternity leaves end - variable w_matlvendm . However, I find that a large chunk of my sample have w_matlvendm & w_matlvendy listed as inapplicable despite the fact that they have non-missing values on variables w_matlvstm and w_matlvsty (maternity leave start month and year). On closer inspection I see that these are people who have a value of 3 on variable w_matlv (SPONTANEOUS Currently on maternity/paternity leave) - i.e. they are still on maternity leave at the time of the interview. For some of these people w_jbstat = maternity leave and so I am able to trace the end of their leave at the next wave using notempchk, empstendm etc. However for a good proportion of them w_jbstat = paid employment (ft/pt) and so, as far as I can tell there is no way of tracing the date of the end of their leave at the next interview. Can I ask whether there is something I am missing in terms of finding out the end date of their leave/ when they returned to their jobs? Can you suggest any alternative methods? Hello,

You are correct in your reading of how the questionnaire works. I am summarising it here.

jbstat and matlv may not match as the former asks about current activity status while the latter about the last week. Sometimes respondents will choose to say they are in paid employment (jbstat=2) rather than on maternity leave (jbstat=5). But then in the employment module they will say they are on maternity leave (matlv=1,3).

All those who said that they were on maternity leave in the employment section (matlv=1 or 3) are asked a start date, and those who said that they were currently on maternity leave were not asked the end date. So, for matlv=1, you have start and end dates but for matlv=3 you only have start dates. Then for these cases you need to check their information in the next wave as to whether they are still on maternity leave or not (using jbstat and matlv). If they are and it has ended then you can use the end date. But if they are not then you will need to impute the end date - which is sometime in between the two interview dates.
