HIQUAL_DV is available for both UKHLS and BHPS 1-18 and is based on additional information about vocational training (see data set documentation). A respondent may, e.g., have a HNC/HND and this would be treated equivalent to having an "other higher degree" in HIQUAL_DV but would in itself not produce a valid value of QFHIGH_DV. QFHIGH_DV can on the other hand be produced on the background of questions only asked in UKHLS and hence with fewer generalisations about some of the categories.
