The information is contained in two main variables: jbsic, which uses the UK SIC 1980 classification and is available until 2001 and jbsic92 which uses the UK SIC 1992 classification and is available from 2001 onwards. I would need a cross-walk to map each category of one of the variables to the closest category in the other variable.

Dear Aina,  
to our knowledge there is no exact mapping of SIC 1980 to SIC 1992. In some waves of the BHPS responses were coded to both coding frames (in waves 4, 7 and 11) so it may be possible to create a mapping from that, or at least to check consistency with mappings suggested by others. The website <http://www2.warwick.ac.uk/fac/soc/economics/staff/jcsmith/sicmapping/resources/direct/> provides useful links to SIC mappings - they are mainly based on the LFS and code to 1- or 2-digit condensed versions of SIC.
