Dear Lucyna,

The question aims to exclude mortgage payments. Mortgage payments wouldn't usually be considered as saving (more like paying down debt) and the question asks for saving. Questions about mortgage payments are asked in the household part of the questionnaire and answered by an adult 'head of household' or bill payer. A question about pensions comes later in the questionnaire.
