## **Description**

Hello,

I'm comparing the financial confidence (variable 'finnow') of people aged 70-79 between 1991 (BHPS) and 2016 (Understanding Society), using data downloaded from the UK Data Service.

I'd like to check I'm using the correct weighting and survey design variables.

I've weighted the data for non-response with ba\_xrwght in 1991, and g\_indinui\_xw in 2016, to select respondents to the main interview (excluding proxy and self-completed).

Using the setsvy command in Stata, I've selected psu (1991) and g\_psu (2016) as the psu variable, and strata (1991) and g\_strata (2016) as the strata variable.

I would appreciate confirmation that this is appropriate, as I am unfamiliar with this survey.

Ngaire,

If I understand correctly, you are carrying out two separate cross-sectional analyses, one for 1991 and one for 2015-16. In that case, the weights and svyset specifications that you describe are correct.

The more difficult part of your analysis might be testing whether there are differences between the two years, due to the complex relationship between the two samples. However, if you use a method appropriate for two independent samples, your test will be slightly conservative, so that is probably acceptable.
