#### **Description**

Hi,

I have a problem to identify the country of birth for a quite large number of observations from wave 2 to wave 7 included.

In the following part, I call missing observation every individual that I was not capable to identify the country of birth.

For the first wave, I used the variables wave\_plbornc\_all and wave\_ukborn to recover this information. Overall, there are only 18 missing observations out of 50,994.

From waves 2 to 7, I know that the UKHLS administered "the place of birth" question only to the first-time respondents who did not answered these questions in the previous waves. Thus, I followed the suggestion from the UK Data Service Help Desk to recover the missing observations from the previous waves and from the file on the stable characteristics named "xwavedat". In addition, I could recover additional missing observations from the variable wave ff ukborn present from wave 2 to wave 7.

Nevertheless, I am still not capable to identify the country of birth for the following numbers of observations:

Wave 2: 1477 Wave 3: 1326 Wave 4: 1206 Wave 5: 1090 Wave 6: 984 Wave 7: 901

Notice that if I use the citizenship variables (wave\_citzn1,2,3; wave\_citzn\_code; wave\_citzn\_code2), I have basically the very same problem. I do not think these are really missing observations. Due to the fact that from wave 2 to 7 the "place of birth" question was asked only to the first-time respondents, I believe that these are not really missing observations, but that I was not capable to find them.

Dear Simone,

Apologies for the delay in response.

I have investigated these cases, and the majority of these respondents are the same people in each wave, as if they have been interviewed previously they will not be asked the question again.

Although some of these people have answered "don't know" or refused to answer the question, most are coded -9 "missing/wild" or -8 "inapplicable" for w\_ukborn in the first wave that they appear in w\_indresp. Checking their age, we can see that most of them are 16 in that wave, so the reason they have not been asked the question is because they have already completed a youth interview, which counts as having been previously interviewed. For those of other ages, it is likely to have been a routing error which caused the question not to be asked.
